Improvement Updates

We're pleased to share a few updates regarding improvements to our school grounds:

- ➤ Playground Refresh: We've secured playground-grade fiber wood chips to replenish the areas on the Hall Street playground that had eroded over time due to weather. The refresh was completed on October 27th. This refresh has significantly improved the condition of the school yard, and both students and staff are happy with the results.
- ➤ **Drainage Maintenance:** The drain hole in the schoolyard regularly backs up during heavy rain, causing puddles. We were able to have that drain, along with the one in the junior yard, professionally cleaned—successfully removing the issue.
- New School Banner: You'll notice a new St. Gabriel School banner on Wellington Street soon. Keep your eyes peeled when walking, cycling, or driving past!
- School Yard Line Painting: We are seeking competitive quotes to repaint the game lines in the school yard to give it a bit of a facelift. If you know of someone who provides this service—or if you are willing to get out and help repaint the lines using asphalt paint—please be in touch with Ms. Emily.
- ➤ Intercom System Upgrade: Our intercom system project is now complete, with the last work finished on Friday, October 24th, 2025.

Eco School Update

- We're continuing to build on our **Eco Schools** initiative, which earned us Gold Certification last year! This fall, we've restarted our classroom and lunchroom composting, with a special thanks to the Transitions class for helping take the compost out each day. We're also continuing our milk carton recycling program, and starting this November, we'll re-launch **Waste-Free Lunches on Mondays** to encourage reusable containers and less packaging in our lunchboxes.
- Our Pollinator Garden was a wonderful success; the plants thrived all summer long! Daycare students have been busy collecting seeds and beans to replant in the spring. To bring the beauty of the garden indoors, artist Emily Read worked with Grade 4A and SEEDS C students to design and create a stunning mural inspired by our garden and its pollinator visitors.
- Our Grade 6 students have been hard at work collecting bottles and cans as part of their grad fundraising efforts. Through this recycling initiative, they have collected over 1,000 bottles and cans, helping to divert waste from landfills, reduce carbon emissions, save energy, and conserve thousands of liters of water. The students are continuing their collection, so please keep sending in your bottles and cans. If possible, rinse them before sending and separate glass, aluminum, and plastic to make sorting easier.
- ➤ We're also excited to welcome Ms. Shannon back to continue her work with our SEEDS, Transitions and daycare students. Together, Ms. Naomi and Ms. Shannon are exploring funding opportunities and applying for grants to help our garden and environmental initiatives continue to grow!

We will be awarding a \$200 scholarship to a deserving Grade 6 student. - ➤ **Student Treats**: Throughout the year, we will continue to provide treats to students for special occasions, including the upcoming Halloween and Christmas celebrations.
